It's Greek To Me! – “I desire mercy”

Jesus was on his way to eat with ‘sinners’. He was stopped by the religious representatives in the town and told he should not go there. Jesus replies, “Go and learn what this means, I desire mercy and not sacrifice.”

We are perhaps so used to Jesus being the ‘nice guy’ that we do not fully appreciate how radical this statement is. Even for Christians today, we can get so blinded by our own self-righteousness that we think being a Christian is a matter of ‘the right sort of folks hanging out with the right sort of folks’. How often in the name of Jesus and his Church have others been condemned!

Jesus certainly went out of his way to make it clear that he had no interest in either spending time with those who thought themselves ‘decent’ (i.e. righteous) or in even taking pains for himself to appear to be righteous. He himself states that he had earned the reputation for being a ‘glutton and a drunkard’.

The word here for ‘mercy’ is ἔλεος - eleos. It can mean mercy, compassion, clemency, a readiness to help those in trouble.

The word for ‘sacrifice’ is Θυσίαν - thoosian. It literally means to make a sacrifice but also can mean a victim.

When we judge others for their actions, faults, insensitivities, sins; we are making them into victims to be sacrificed on the altar of our own self-righteousness; a sacrificial offering that God does not accept. Jesus is not interested in driving people deeper into their own self-chosen darkness. He comes as light to draw us out from our personal prisons. The light he draws us by is his compassionate invitation to experience his mercy.

Perhaps we can translate this passage a bit more fully in English as:

“You need to learn the same compassionate readiness to help others that God has; not making others the victims of your own judgment on them.”

How freeing to be able to let go of our judgment of others. How liberating for others to experience the merciful invitation of God through us!


- Kitchen equipment for a homeless shelter

The Discernment Journey

The is the first article in which I will keep you all up to date on what is happening with me in the journey of discernment for Holy Orders.

I am required to have a 'Companion' on this journey and the Rev. John Sullivan in Austin has kindly consented to be in that role for me. We have met twice in person in a coffee house in Austin and we do bump into one another online at diocesan meetings as well!

I am also required to have a Spiritual Director. I have met twice on Zoom with Mary Webble, who is a trained Spiritual Director.

I have completed a course online with Diocesan School for Formation called Missional I. It was a review of the theology and theory of the new thinking surrounding the church's mission and role in the 21st century. It emphasizes being focused on being disciples and finding out what

God is doing in our neighborhoods and finding ways to join in with God's work; rather than being focused on how to grow our church.

I am also just now finishing a second course on Discernment. This has been an exploration of the various ordained roles in the Church.

In addition, all discerners and their companions meet once a month on Zoom and enter into a set program of discernment. We had our first official meeting on Oct. 17. Our next meeting will be Nov. 14. At that meeting I will discuss my spiritual autobiography, which I am now writing and will send out to all members of the discernment team.

Please continue to pray for me and all discerners in Minnesota, that God will make clear to us and to those who are evaluating us, what the future shape of our ministry is to be.





September 5, 2021

Please keep Phiz and Kim and Chris in your prayers. Saturday the 18th is Kim's mom's funeral at First Presbyterian. Chris' husband is been in and out of the hospital in the past few weeks, and so she needs some thoughts and prayers.

Old Business:

Senior Warden update: We have been in contact with the Diocese and made George the delegate of this years convention for our parish. This has previously been Savile's responsibility, but with George's interest in the process, Father Henry and she decided that he would appreciate the experience.

Junior Warden Update: More things are getting crossed off the list. Please make sure you list any thing that needs to be attended to on the board outside Father Henry's office.

Financial Report: Clemencia will have a retreat that's October 9th. Building use presently is from her Yoga classes, her retreat will be listed under a separate category. Jeff motioned to approve the financial report and Savile seconded.

Bible study will start next Sunday the 12th at 9:15. A schedule of future dates will be decided soon.

The air conditioning in the office is not cooling. The Vestry agreed to let George work for home on the days it is too hot to work in the office.

New Business:

Bishop visit: The Bishop will be here on October 17th. We will have a coffee hour that Joy will host. We will have 3 coffee hours that month, but it will be lovely.

Peggy replacement: Peggy will be leaving for Tennessee in the next few weeks, and so we will need a replacement for her on the vestry. Otherwise we will need to reform how the Vestry is organized. With Peggy's departure it will leave Savile, Kenneth and Jeff on the Vestry.
