It's Greek to Me - Luke 1:38 - "Let it be with me, just as you say"



The Annunciation of our Lord Jesus Christ to the Blessed Virgin Mary -April 8

The Blessed Virgin Mary is one of the most remarkable people in the Bible as well as in history. She said "Yes" to God, no matter what the cost; and the cost turned out to be

very high indeed. When she brought Jesus to the temple as an infant, a prophet told her that her heart would be pierced as if with a sword, and that certainly was the case. If ever there was an example that those who follow God are not exempt from heartache, she is definitely one.

When the angel Gabriel announced the coming of Christ to her, she simply said. "Let it be with me, just as you say". She had a very clear understanding of what this could mean for her in

her culture. She would be considered a sinful woman, worthy of death under Jewish law. It would likely ruin her chances for marriage or for any position in her society. And yet she said "Yes".

Later, when Jesus began his ministry, she found it difficult to even stay in touch with him, but she still said "Yes".

She had to endure seeing him on the cross, holding his body in her arms, seeing him buried. But she still said "Yes".

The Greek word here translated as "Let it be with me" is 'genoito' and it means "may it be becoming" and occurs many times in the New Testament. It does not mean a single moment of commitment fueled by religious sentiment or feeling – it means a commitment to an on-going unfolding of God's action in one's life. It is an open-ended commitment, one that puts no conditions on itself. It is a full embracing of God's will, a trusting in the loving purposes of God no matter what.

And because of that continuous "Yes" she was also there to experience the resurrection and the birth of the Church at Pentecost.

Are we ready to say "Yes". It is only through that "Yes" that we come to the joy of the Resurrection. Why does God require such a deep commitment as this? Because He, as our Creator, knows that this was what we were born for and, in fulfilling our purpose, we will find true peace and joy – a peace and joy that the world is not capable of giving, no matter how 'easy' we manage to make our lives apart from Him.

Fr. Henry - Please keep me in the loop

Far too often, you might hesitate to inform me of your desire/need for pastoral care, because you do not want to bother me. On the contrary, you are not bothering me when you inform me of a major illness, yours or a loved one's illness. Because of privacy issues and regulations, staff at hospitals, nursing homes, and other health care facilities will not contact me. You, a family member, or a close friend must contact me, if you have a pastoral need.

So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he

wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you.
